RULES OF CONDUCT AND SAFETY

Preamble

At Harmony School we believe students, parents, teachers and support staff must promote and behave in ways that are safe for ourselves and others. Physical safety while paramount is not our only goal. Each person at our school must always be treated respectfully. Verbal abuse, disrespect or rudeness towards support staff, will not be tolerated. In an emotionally healthy environment, each student is free to learn to the best of their ability, each teacher can focus on teaching and learning, and each parent can rest assured that their child is receiving a good education. Following are the guidelines developed by the staff and approved by the Governing Board at Harmony to ensure the optimum learning environment for students.

Rules

- 1) > I show respect for myself and others.
 - > I do not participate in, nor tolerate, swearing, rudeness and/or bullying both verbal and physical, of any form.
- 2) I work respectfully with my peers and the school material.
 - I focus my energy during instructional time in order to learn, I collaborate with my peers and I use all school material with care.
- 2) I engage in mutually fun play and I am non-violent.
 - > I do not fight, engage in rough play, nor shoot projectiles (such as snowballs or rocks).
- 4) I respect myself, the school and my community.
 - > I keep the environment clean and report any vandalism.

RULES HAVE CONSEQUENCES

Consequences for Rule Violation

At Harmony School we take misbehaviour seriously. For infractions such as rough play, throwing snowballs or other projectiles, rudeness, refusal to work, etc., the consequences would be a recess or lunch reflection, completing a reflection sheet, missing an extra-curricular activity, etc. For serious infractions such as fighting, insubordination, bullying, etc., consequences may include recess and/or lunch reflection, missing extra-curricular activities and/or field trips, in-school suspension, or home suspension. For a suspended student to be readmitted, the parents and the student must meet with the principal. Please note that any behaviour that compromises the safety of the student and/or others, specifically dangerous or violent behaviour or refusal to follow safety rules or teacher instructions, will result in parents being required to immediately pick up their child. School board policies will be enforced if a situation warrants. Other authorities may play a role if necessary. To keep track of infractions, the "Office Referral" form is used. One copy will be emailed to the parents and one copy remains in the child's file.

As well, students with behaviour difficulties may be required to work on their behaviour through a behaviour contract, a series of workshops for the pupil, a restitution plan, alternative placement, and/or a referral to other resources.



Consequences for Bullying and Harassment (Harmony Anti-Bullying & Anti-Violence Plan)

Our goal is to prevent and stop all forms of bullying and violence targeting a student, a teacher or any other school staff member. If any form of bullying or harassment is observed and documented, a school "Office Referral" sheet will be filled out, parents of both the victim(s) and the perpetrator will be contacted, and according to Law 19, the school board "Bullying Incident Report Form" and "Bullying Incident Follow-up Form", will be filled out and sent to the school board.

School rules, policies, and consequences apply in the building, in the yard, on school trips, and on buses. However, consequences of the Transportation Policy EEA supersede our consequences.

Notification of Parents

Parents are notified, via our "Office Referral" form/email/Class DOJO/TEAMS and in most cases a call home, in the event of serious or repeated misbehaviour. For infractions such as rough play, rudeness, refusal to work, etc., a note is written in the student's agenda. Parents are asked to sign the agenda to acknowledge receipt of the note. For serious infractions such as fighting, insubordination, bullying, etc., parents will be contacted by phone or through our "Office Referral". Parents are expected to be partners in the behaviour of their child at school.

School Event Social Media Guide

Social media tools like Facebook and You tube are here to stay, and it's our responsibility as parents, teachers and staff to not only use social media well ourselves, but to guide the children in our care as they grow up to become happy, healthy citizens of tomorrow's digital world. This said Harmony realizes that capturing school events digitally is an important aspect of all our families in our community. Due to this, pictures and video will be allowed to be taken at school events if parents agree to not post, publish, or upload video and pictures onto social media sites without the permission of parents whose children also appear in the pictures and or video.

Character Pillar Assemblies

Each 6-8 weeks an assembly on our character education program theme (Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring and Citizenship).

• Fee Collection

In order for a student to participate in school activities and/or field trips for which there is a cost to students, school fees, workbooks and all other outstanding balances must be paid in full. You can find your statement of account on the Parent Portal.

SCHOOL PROCEDURES

- Peanut/nut products: Peanut and nut products are forbidden. We are a nut and peanut free school. We kindly ask you not to send cakes and/or baked goods or other treats to be served in the classroom for birthdays, holidays or other school events. We are concerned about various food allergies and lost instructional time.
- Healthy eating/morning snack: should be fruit, vegetables, cheese, milk, yogurt, water.
- Injuries: Parents will be notified in case of injury or illness and are expected to pick up their child.
- Bicycles: Bicycles brought to school must be locked, using racks provided, upon arrival.
- Personal Items: Aside from school related items, no personal items may be brought to school. This includes but is not exclusive to: toys, any electronic devices, jewelry, skateboards, cards, roller blades, dolls etc. Please keep these items at home or risk confiscation. Items contravening School Board Policy will be dealt with as per policy.
- **Dress Code:** School is your place of business; please wear clean clothes that cover you appropriately. No rude or violent images, no spaghetti straps or bare mid sections. Also, pants must fit so they don't fall off. Sleepwear is only permitted when it is a pajama day. Headwear (for example hats, baseball caps, hoodies, etc...) must be removed when entering the school unless worn for religious reasons. Gym clothes (Harmony Green t-shirt is recommended) and shoes are needed for physical education.

- **School Closures:** Please listen to local radio stations before school starts. CJAD 800AM; CHOM 97.7FM; MIX96 95.9FM; Q92 92.5FM or check the New Frontiers School Board Facebook page.
- Traveling in Public Areas: Walk and keep a low voice in all public areas. Use the right-hand side of the staircase/hall when traveling. Bring a note or pass to office/bathroom if required.
- Shoes: Indoor shoes must be exchanged for outdoor footwear before entering gym or classrooms.
- Entry from Recess: At Harmony, entering the school after recess is done in an orderly way as a transition to returning to schoolwork and for safety. When the bell rings at the end of recess, students are expected to line up by class and quietly return to their classroom led by their teacher.
- Daycare: Daycare policies will be implemented as per Handbook but do not supersede Harmony or School Board policy.
- **Physical Education:** Physical Education is part of the curriculum. All students are expected to participate unless there is a medical problem. A doctor's note must be provided if students are not taking part in gym classes. All students must wear a T-shirt (Harmony Green t-shirt is recommended), shorts and running shoes.
- **Books belonging to the School:** Students are responsible to return books in good condition. Parents will be responsible to pay for books that are damaged or lost. Should your child bring home a damaged book, please notify the school so that you will not be charged.
- Change of Address/Phone: It is essential the office be informed whenever there is a change of address or telephone number, be it at home or at the office. Should the emergency contact change, the office must be informed of that too.

Tardiness/Leaving Early:

- Students must arrive to school prepared with all that they need be it shoes, snow pants, lunch.
- Students leaving the building early as well as leaving for lunch must have a note from home and will be expected to sign out in the book at the office.
- Students are expected to arrive on time and be prepared for class with appropriate materials. All items must be clearly identified with names.
- In the event of an absence, late arrival, please report absences on the parent portal.
- Late Arrivals: Students must arrive at school on time. This is important because students who do not arrive on time are assumed to be at home. For safety reasons we should know where all students are during school hours. Students who arrive late must be signed in by a parent. Students who arrive late without a parent or note will be given a note explaining this policy and must return with it signed the next day and/or be given a recess detention. Frequent lateness will necessitate a parent meeting with the principal. Arriving late to class will result in a consequence from the teacher: recess or lunch detention, reflection sheet, missing an extra-curricular activity, etc. Changes to a student's routine require a note in the agenda from the parent.

Absenteeism/Illness/Injury:

- Parents are asked to **report their child's absence on the parent portal**.
- Please make sure the school has accurate work and emergency telephone numbers where you can always be reached. Parents need to be available for children who are injured or not feeling well. Public health rules stipulate that children who are ill remain at home. If the child has been sick during the night, they should stay home the next day.

Extra-Curricular Activities:

- Harmony encourages students to participate in extra-curricular activities at noon hour and after school.
- Students are expected to have written permission from their parents to stay after regular school hours.
- Phoning home for last minute permission is not permitted as it frequently leads to confusion.

CAFETERIA RULES AND PROCEDURES

Rules

- > Sit down and eat lunch.
- > Speak in a normal voice.
- > Treat student supervisors with respect and follow their instructions.

Consequences of breaking these rules.

- > Required to sit at another table.
- > Change of lunch schedule.
- Not permitted to eat in lunchroom for a period of time.
- > Not permitted to have lunch at school.

Cafeteria Procedures

- First Lunch: When the bell rings, students will follow their teacher to the lunchroom. Students may only enter the lunchroom when teacher/student supervisor allows them to go in. Students will be assigned a table at which to sit for the year.
- > **Second Lunch:** When the bell rings, students will follow lunch supervisor's instructions to enter the school and proceed to the cafeteria.
- > Tables will be called to the lunch line when the student supervisors deem that they are ready or on a rotational basis.
- > Students should speak to people at their own table. Shouting from table to table is not peaceful.
- Garbage is to be kept at the table until the end of lunch at which time students must collect and dispose of it. Student supervisors are asked to go to students' tables and supervise the pick-up of items on floor and tabletops. Two monitors per class are assigned weekly to do a final clean-up.
- > Students may not get up during lunch. Students need to put up their hands if they need to talk to a supervisor.
- > When needed, a signal will be used to get students' attention so that a supervisor may speak to them.

RECESSES & LUNCH

Outdoor Recesses

> Students will participate in two outdoor recesses daily and should dress according to the weather. If students are ill, they are to stay at home. If for any reason students need to stay indoors at recess time, a note from the doctor is required.

Indoor Recesses

- Morning and afternoon recesses: Students spend recess in their classrooms and are not permitted to roam the halls. A hallway pass is required at all times in order to leave the classroom.
- **Lunch:** When students are not in the cafeteria, they spend recess in their classrooms and are not permitted to roam the halls. A hallway pass is required at all times in order to leave the classroom.

HARMONY'S VISITOR PROTOCOL

SECURITY OF OUR STUDENTS AND STAFF IS OUR FOREMOST CONCERN AT HARMONY.

- > The purpose of this protocol is to provide for the security and safety of all staff and students as well as any visitors to our school.
- Visitors are defined as any persons who are not staff members or registered students of our school.

ALL VISITORS MUST REPORT DIRECTLY TO THE OFFICE UPON ARRIVAL

- Visits or appointments with the administrator can usually be arranged on short notice, however, a phone call in advance will ensure an appointment and save a trip to the school should the administrator not be in the building or be unavailable at the time.
- Visits with teachers or other staff members must be arranged in advance. Teachers will notify the office of arrangements to have visitors during or after school hours.



- > Forgotten lunches, money, books, clothing, etc. should be left with the secretary in the office.
- > It is forbidden for parents to enter the primary and senior schoolyards at all times.
- Parents bringing their children to school at the start of the day are to drop them off at the senior schoolyard entrance on De Gaulle boulevard without entering the schoolyard themselves and are asked to leave immediately as to give other parents room to drop off their child/children as well. (this is not the time or place to socialize)
- > The school does not provide supervision after dismissal. Parents picking up their children at the end of the day are to meet them at the gate on De Gaulle boulevard and leave the premises promptly. Students are not allowed to remain playing on school property, in either schoolyard, on the grass or snowbanks in the winter, after dismissal.
- > Students who go home for lunch must exit and enter via the Office door. The student must sign out when he/she leaves and sign in when he/she returns.
- > Students cannot be removed from buses in the loading zone. Please come to or notify the office in advance if there are changes to routine.
- Visitors (e.g., Parent volunteers, tutors, etc.) working in the school must complete a declaration concerning a judicial record every 3 years. Visitors/volunteers must sign in at the office upon arrival and sign out before leaving the building. Anyone found in the building without an approved judicial record or without reporting to the office first will be asked to return to the office or leave the building.
- UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES ARE VISITORS PERMITTED TO VISIT CLASSROOMS OR OTHER AREAS OF THE BUILDING WITHOUT PERMISSION FROM THE OFFICE.

Should a visitor not cooperate, the school has the right to call the police who will intervene in the situation.

HARMONY DAYCARE

Harmony's daycare is open to all students from K4 through Level 6. The daycare publishes a handbook with extensive information about their rules and procedures. Anyone needing a copy please contact the daycare technician.

- Regular Status (min. of 2 sessions /day): \$8.95/day.

- Sporadic/Occasional Status: \$3.00 AM 8.95 PM (must call or email 24 hours in advance).
- Pedagogical Day fees: 12.00/day plus activity fees if applicable.

You must be registered in order to use daycare services. Daycare is not offered for "on-call' basis. Please park in the circle or on the street in front of the school.

Program of Activities:

- Arts and crafts, innovative and creative activities, gym and outdoor play, and much more.
- Independent homework time/Relaxation time: 4:30 PM 5:00 PM Mondays-Thursdays.

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY RULES

- Always be at the bus stop on time.
- Do not play on the street while waiting for your bus.
- Wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and then board the school bus in single file, in an orderly fashion, using the handrail.
- Find a seat quickly without pushing other students. Keep the aisle clear.
- Remain seated, talk quietly. Do not eat, drink, or leave trash on the bus.
- When riding the school bus, the driver is in charge. Always listen to the driver's instructions.
- Never put your head or arms out the window.
- Know where the emergency exits are but DO NOT tamper with the emergency exits.
- Never throw anything in the bus or out of the windows.
- When getting off, wait until the bus comes to a complete stop before leaving your seat.
- Descend in a single file.
- Walk a safe distance from the bus so the driver can see you and know that you are out of danger.
- Should you need to cross in front of the bus, keep a safe distance and watch for the driver's signal.

POLICY REGARDING CONTAGIOUS DISEASES IN SCHOOLS

Updated: 99-06-07

Under the school board policy EBBA, the school is required to inform parents of the policy regarding contagious diseases at the beginning of each school year.

Basic premises:

- All school age children are required to provide proof of vaccination against diphtheria, pertussis (whooping cough), tetanus, polio myelitis, measles, rubella, and mumps. Haemophilus influenza type b1.
- If a child exhibits signs of a contagious disease of any sort which could be transmissible in the school setting parents are required to:
 - inform the school after evaluation by a doctor or CLSC Nurse.
 - keep the child at home until a certificate or a telephone confirmation from a doctor, CLSC nurse, or Regional Health official is received by the school indicating that the child can return to school.
- It is the responsibility of the School Administration to the best of their ability to establish and ensure that the school environment is clean and functioning properly. For your information, a list of the diseases that are included in this policy and the procedure regarding who will report them is available at school.

CONCLUSION

This Code of Conduct and Safety outlines our major initiatives regarding a safe and healthy school environment. To be a true learning community we must know our expectations of each other and try to achieve them. Parents are pivotal partners in the safety and the behaviour in our school. Please take the time to review this document with your child.
