Did you know that Mars is discovered by Galileo Galilei in 1610?

Mars has longer days then us because a day on Earth is 24 hours but on Mars it's 24 hours 37 minutes and 22 seconds. Mars has two moons called the Phobos and the other one is called the Deimos. Mars can have huge dust storms witch last for months which can cover the entire planet. Mars has a nickname called the Red Moon because it has lots of iron in the soil.
