MEMORY BOOSTERS

If there is a question you do not understand, try reading it aloud. Think calmly about its meaning. Do not give up.

Sometimes your brain can think better when it hears rather than sees the question.

Make up phrases or sentences using the first letter of words you are trying to memorize.

For example, the order of operations for solving math problems without parentheses is multiplication, division, addition, subtraction. Remember this by using the phrase, "My Dear Aunt Sally."
